MESSAGES TO TAKE HOME, approved by the EB ERN-Skin Thematic group:

- ✓ The benefits of breast milk, in particular breast-feeding, for mother and baby are well known: it is recommended to exclusively breastfeed for the first six months of life, whenever it is possible.
- ✓ Breast milk and breast-feeding are recommended not only for babies born at term but also for premature babies.
- ✓ Newborn babies with epidermolysis bullosa (EB) can be effectively breast-fed with many benefits.
- ✓ The benefits are related to the nutritional effects of breast milk as well as to the close contact between mother and baby (Kangaroo care).

✓ Procedure:

- First, lubricate the baby's lips and the breast, to avoid friction while sucking and to prevent blistering of the mouth
- Then train-support the mother to start breastfeed the baby
- Learn the mother how to hold the baby: turn the baby face to the mother, the left hand under the breast, the right one supports the baby
- With the left hand squeeze the breast to help the baby in getting milk
