OVERVIEW OF OUR 2026 CPMS & THEMATIC GROUP MEETINGS CALENDAR

For 2026, our CPMS and Thematic Group Meetings will follow a new structure.

HOW does it work?

- The year is divided into **3 sessions**.
- Every group has **one meeting per session**.

WHEN are the 3 sessions?

- 1st session: January to March 2026
- 2nd session: May to June 2026
- 3rd session: September to October 2026

NEW MEETING FORMAT IN 2026

Meetings will follow this new structure:

- Total meeting duration: 2 hours
- Each meeting will begin with the **CPMS case presentation(s)** (1 hour)
- Followed by the **Group Meeting** (1 hour)

OVERVIEW OF OUR 2026 CPMS MEETINGS

Case Presentation Rules

- **Each group has to present at least ONE CPMS case per meeting**
- The group should agree on who will present
- **You have to inform Julia NEVEU and the group at least 1 month before the meeting**

Outside group presenters

- If someone **outside of the group** would like to present a case, this is possible
- You just need to inform Julia NEVEU **1 month in advance**

Which type of clinical case can I present?

- It could be a **clinical case** questioning **diagnosis** or **treatment**
- It could be a **didactic case** already presented at conferences
- It could be several patient cases all related to the same pathology or thematic within a pathology (for instance a specific treatment)

Who can attend?

- **All ERN-Skin clinicians are invited to the CPMS sessions**, regardless of their group
- This gives everyone a chance to learn, observe, and exchange knowledge
- Case details will be shared with the entire ERN-Skin **before the meeting**

Inviting other ERNs

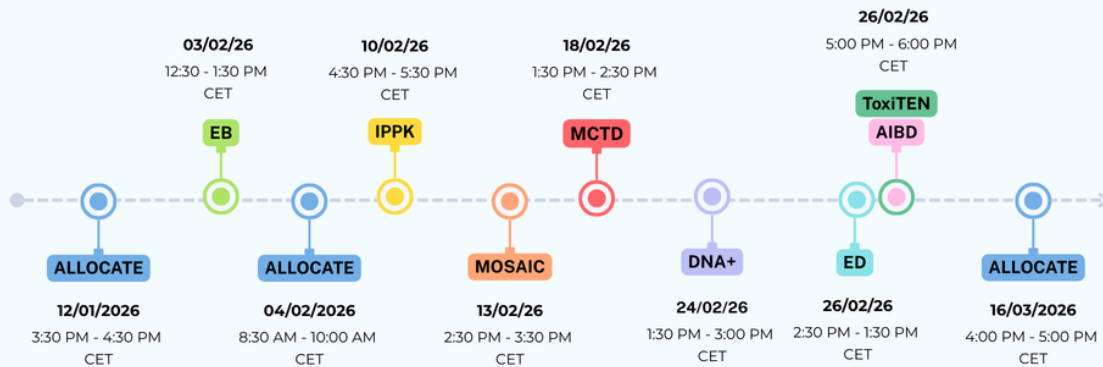
- If you feel another ERN should be involved, we can invite them

Outside scheduled meetings or urgent meetings

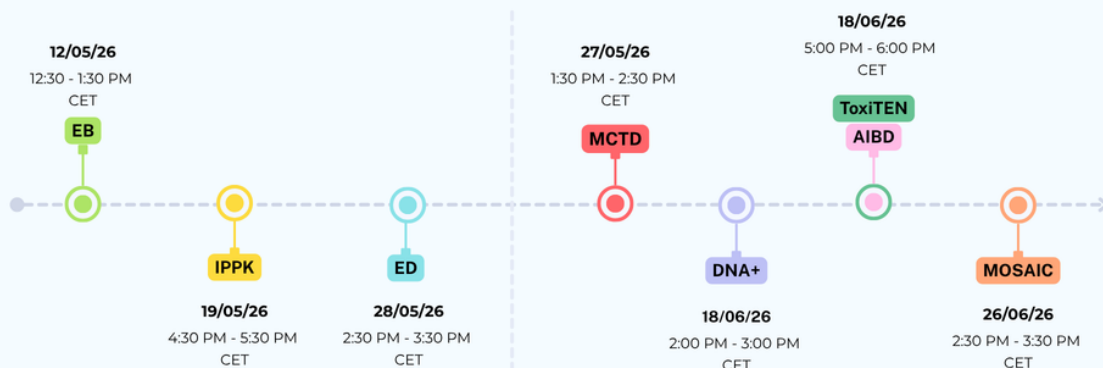
You can contact Julia NEVEU at any time if you want to present an **additional clinical case outside the planned meetings**

TIMELINE OF CPMS MEETINGS

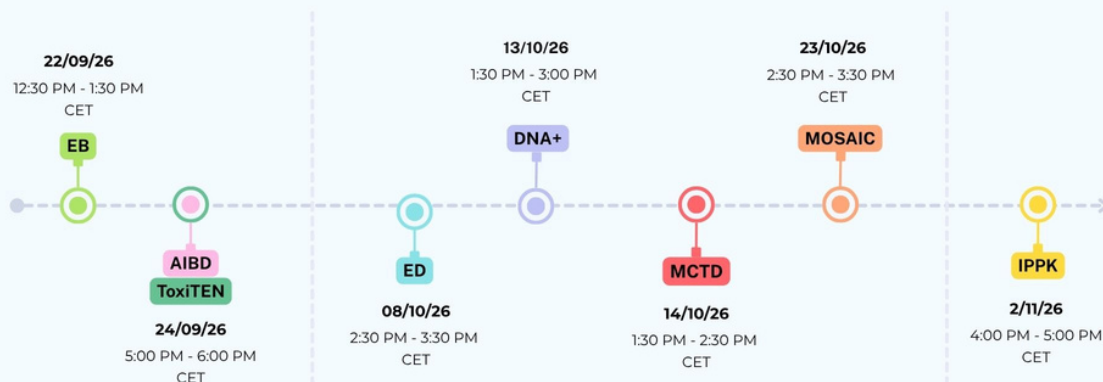

- Autoimmune Bullous Diseases
- Acquired immunological LOW prevalence and Complex Adult diseases of the SKIN
- Cutaneous diseases related to DNA repair disorders and photosensitivity
- Ectodermal Dysplasias including Incontinentia Pigmenti and p63-associated disorders
- Inherited Epidermolysis Bullosa and skin fragility syndromes – Darier disease – Hailey-Hailey disease
- Ichthyosis and Palmoplantar Keratoderma
- Mendelian connective tissue disorders
- Cutaneous Mosaic Disorders: Naevi & Naevoid skin disorders – Complex vascular malformations and cutaneous and subcutaneous vascular tumors
- Severe Cutaneous Drug Reactions – Toxic Bullous Diseases
